

Who is Most at Risk on the Slope?

Okay, so who is at risk for catastrophic injuries or death on the slope? If you guessed the 16-to 25-year-olds who zoom down the mountain at breakneck speeds and startle you as you leisurely slide down the mountain, you'd be wrong. Yes, According the statistics from the National Ski Areas Association (NASSA), men are at the highest risk, but... men between 51 and 60 years old are most likely injured! Men at this age don't usually think of themselves as having diminished physical abilities, but with age we lose strength and agility. What makes this group so prone to injury is that they still think of themselves as being 30 something – and they are not. So, they take more risks.

What does this mean for us who are beyond 60. The article This Group of Skiers is the Most Likely to Have a Fatal Accident, According to Experts from Ski Magazine does not specifically discuss our age group, but a take away is that we must recognize our abilities when we are on the slopes. We should pay attention to what our bodies are telling us. Take a break and pace ourselves. Above all, don't ski alone and have a safe run!
