Hi Rise Ski Club New Ohio Wine Information January 2025

This past weekend we attended our Vino Wine Club meeting and tasted the latest Gold Medal Ohio Wines. The wine makers from Debonne Vineyards, South River, M Cellars, Cask 307, Salvage Winery, and Kosicek Vineyards each presented their award-winning wines. All were excellent but there were a few standouts.

- 1) Debonne Vineyards Chardonnay 2022 Double Gold -GRV
- 2) South River Semillon 2023 Double Gold GRV
- 3) M-Cellars Pinot Gris 2023 Gold GRV
- 4) Cask 307 Red Blend Gold A
- 5) Salvage Winery Syrah Gold A
- 6) Kosicek Vineyards Cabernet Sauvignon 2022 Gold A

GRV- are estate grown grapes from the Grand River Valley in Ohio, A- some American grapes from the United States, not from the Grand River Valley or Ohio.

I liked all the wines above, but the Debonne Chardonnay and the South River Semillon are real standouts. I would go for a taste at these wineries soon and then make your purchases. The Semillon is a special vintage in which the vintage only produced 1/3 the normal harvest and created a more intense fruity wine. The Chardonnay is well balanced and has complexity and is great alone or with food. If you taste these wines, let me know your tasting results. Another note: I was able to participate and help Kosicek Vineyards harvest their Vidal Blanc Ice Wine grapes in December and recently in January their Concord Ice Wine Grapes. In both cases the temperatures were below 17 degrees F. We started at 4AM on the Vidal and 5AM on the Concord grapes, about 2 hours each time, very cold but it was not windy, like the recent cold spell we just had. I heard the wines are doing well in a slow cool controlled fermentation. We were able to barrel taste their upcoming Kosicek Petite Syrahsone in American Oak barrels and one in French Oak barrels. Both will be great wines, but they taste totally different. They should be bottled in the next few months. I will keep you posted. The grapes are from the most southern wine region in California, Temecula.

MEMBERSHIP- You must be a member of Hi Rise to tace for our team

RACE SCHEDULE- Available at meetings, on our Web Site, in the Newsletter.

ADVANCE REGISTRATION- Forms available at meetings, on Web Site in Newsletter. Hi Rise will pay race fees for racers who advance register and start 5 or more races. Some races will be advance register only. To register yourself on race day will cost you at least \$22.00.

COMBINED RACE WEEKENDS- Skier Combined is at Bristol; Snowboard Combined at Swain II. BOTH ARE ADVANCE REGISTER ONLY. Skier Combined requires that yourself have two races started before hand. Snowboard Combined, one.

WORK ASSIGNMENTS- For each race we must supply a certain number of race workers. Assignments are posted in the bib pick up area and it is your responsibility to check the list. If you are assigned to work, show up at least 15 minutes prior to the start of the race. If you prefer to either work at or not work a particular race, let Guy or Rick know at least a week prior to the race. Racers who fail to show for a work assignment will be DQ'D.

HELMETS- Are required for every race.

NO BYOB- Please do not bring your own booze onto the ski area premises.

LIFT TICKETS- Some areas may offer discounts for racers.

DQ & RESULT SHEETS- Are usually posted in the bib pick up area about an hour after the last race of the day. It's your job to check and verify times and / or a DQ. If you dispute either, you have a half hour from the posting time to file a protest.

START TIMES- For most races will be 10:00 AM for the first GROUP of the day.

RACE ORDER- For most races: GROUP I- Super SR Vet, Open Elite, AAW. AAM, AW, AM, BBM, A Qualifiers. GROUP II- SR VET, BBW, BBM, BW, BM, CCW, CCM, CM., C Qualifiers. Then, All Snowboarders. Always check start order in bib pick up area.

CLASS CHANGES- If you want to change your racer class, you must do so through Guy or Rick at least a week before the next race.

QUALIFICATION- For both skiers and boarders, if you have never raced in a CMSC race before, or have not for some time, you and qualify at any race by registering as a QUALIFER and making two runs on the race course, after which you will be assigned to a race class that matches your ability level.

There is Still Room on the Steamboat Trip!


If you missed out on the Jackson Hole trip, there is space on the Steamboat Trip! But hurry time is running out and space is limited. BTW... Colorado was dumped on this week with record snow fall!

Steamboat has a fascinating history. The town of Steamboat Springs originated from the hunting grounds of Native Americans to a French fur trappers. The first settler, James Crawford and his family arrived. With his encouragement businessmen came to the area to start a sawmill and the town began to grow.

Carl Howelsen arrived in 1914 who brought skiing to the areas in the form of ski jumping and a winter carnival. By the 1950's a ski area was established called Storm Mountain, now Mount Werner named after a former Olympian skier from the area. To learn more, click here.





According to Google Steamboat "The summit of Steamboat Mountain in Steamboat Springs, Colorado is 10,568 feet (3,221 meters) high. The base elevation of the ski resort is 6,900 feet (2,103 meters). Steamboat Mountain has 169 named trails, 18 lifts, and over 4.6 square miles of skiable terrain. The trail system is divided into 14% beginner, 42% intermediate, and 44% advanced trails. The longest run is over 3 miles long." And Steamboat covers six mountains including Mount Werner, Sunshine Peak, Storm Peak, Thunderhead Peak, Mahogany Ridge, and Christie Peak. We

are staying in town at the Holiday Inn. See page 17.

How did Corbet's Couloir get it Name?

Fifty-one Hi Risers are headed for Jackson Hole later this month. Many of you will venture up the mountain to see legendary Corbet's Coulior? Who will ski the twenty foot drop in an upside down funnel shape onto a wide ski run? The legendary run even has an annual celebration called the Kings and Queens of Corbet's Couloir. Nice, but how did it get its name?

In 1960 a Darmouth college student named Barry Corbet was on a mountaineering tour of the mountain that later became Jackson Hole first described the couloir. His challenge to skiiers was someday someone will ski this. Jackson Hole did not open for skiers for another six years in 1966. One year later someone did ski it but not Barry Corbet. Loni Ball first skiied Corbet's Couloir, not Corbet himself! Corbet did ski it later but that date and story were not recorded. The couloir was later named after Barry Corbet who was a ski instructor and mountain guide at Jackson Hole.

Barry Corbet did not finish Darmouth, instead, he took up residence in Jackson as a ski instuctor and guide. More importantly, he was a filmaker and writer. Barry was involed in a helicopter crash in 1968 leaving him a parapalegic. He was not detoured by his new circumstances, but helped others with documentaries and
